Countless courageous Rhodesli descendants fought in World War II. This section is dedicated to one of the many who did not return.

David Alhadeff was born in Los Angeles. He was the son of Perahia "Peter" Alhadeff and Sarina de Leon who were born in Rhodes and immigrated to the United States during the early 1920s. David attended Manual Arts High School.

In England during his preparation of the "D-Day Invasion" he wrote a letter home on May 12, 1944 to his cousin, Sylvia Levy Aboulafia. The D-Day Invasion began on June 6, 1944. David Alhadeff died on June 11th.



David Alhadeff is buried in the Normandy American Cemetery, Plot F Row 1, Grave 34. He died during the Normandy Invasion as a member of the "Infantry Glider Group," which belonged to the 327th Infantry Regiment, 101st Airborne Division. May his courage and sacrifice be remembered and honored forever.
